Chrismon Chorale welcomes you to its Fall 2023 concerts. Following a two-year COVID-related pause, the Chorale (formerly known as Twin Cities Master's Chorale) returned with a renewed vision and with a new name. The Chorale, however, remains dedicated to the same mission: "to present concerts exclusively from the collected works of sacred choral music that comfort, uplift, and inspire, seeking to perform them with the highest level of musicality and artistry, singing as people who personally believe and know the truth of the message that they proclaim, and who offer them as a sacrifice to the glory of God."

In keeping with the Chorale's new name, a contraction of the Latin, "Christi monogramma" — monogram of Christ — we desire to represent Christ through the music we sing and the sacred truths that are embodied in the musical text. The letters in the Chrismon on the cover, IHS, represent Jesus with His name's first three letters: iota, eta, and sigma. In upper case letters, Jesus' name in Greek is  $IH\Sigma OY\Sigma$ . The English letters that correspond are IHSOUS. The Chorale was founded in 1992. Chorale members, who belong to many Christian denominations in the metropolitan area, rehearse weekly for three months prior to annual Fall and Spring concerts, performing primarily in church worship spaces. May the music we sing comfort, strengthen and encourage your heart, mind and spirit.

## Chrismon Chorale Conductor and Accompanist

LARRY BACH, the Musical and Artistic Director of Chrismon Chorale, recently retired from North Central University in Minneapolis where he served as Chair of the Music Department and as Dean of the College of Fine Arts. He also founded the NCU Women's Choir and conducted the NCU Concert Chorale. Under Bach's direction, the Concert Chorale performed in over 20 countries and had two solo performances at Carnegie Hall in New York City. In the Spring of 2023, Bach conducted the premiere of Michael John Trotta's "Te Deum," at the David Geffen Hall at Lincoln Center, New York City.

Throughout his career, Bach has been a frequent clinician and guest conductor in high schools, colleges, community choirs, and church choirs. He has twice had the honor of conducting Minnesota All State choirs. He has also led many church choirs, currently serving as Canticle Choir Director for St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Eden Prairie, MN.

Bach sang professionally with the Dale Warland Singers from 1983 to 2003, serving as Assistant Conductor from 2000 to 2003. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in vocal performance from West Virginia Wesleyan University, a Master of Music in choral conducting from the University of Minnesota, and has completed all course work and examinations for a Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting from the University of Iowa.

JOSHUA TOMPKINS, accompanist for Chrismon Chorale, serves as Director of Music and Theater at North Central University in Minneapolis, where he has taught Music Theory and Piano for over 20 years. He accompanies the NCU Concert Chorale, Women's Choir, and Festival Choir for rehearsals and concerts, and has accompanied the Concert Chorale on multiple tours throughout the United States and Europe, including their concerts in Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center.

Tompkins has performed extensively as a concert pianist and freelance artist over his professional career with numerous recordings under his label and other national record labels. He enjoys performing an extensive repertoire that includes classical, sacred, pop, and jazz. He has also produced and arranged music for other local artists and loves helping others pursue the art of music making.

Tompkins is also Director of Music at Presbyterian Church of the Way in Shoreview, MN, where he conducts the choir and leads the worship band, making music with his church family—a highlight of the week. He has also conducted the orchestra for their last five shows at Faith Community Theater in Minnetonka.

Tompkins has earned a Bachelor of Music, a Master of Music, and a Doctor of Musical Arts from the University of Minnesota.

# Dr. Dan Forrest Biography

DAN FORREST (b. 1978) is recognized as having "an undoubted gift for writing beautiful music....that is truly magical" (NY Concert Review), with compositions hailed as "magnificent, very cleverly constructed sound sculpture" (Classical Voice), and "superb writing...full of spine-tingling moments" (Salt Lake Tribune). His music has sold millions of copies, has received numerous awards and distinctions, and has become well established in the repertoire of choirs internationally. Forrest's compositions range widely, and include small choral works, solo instrumental works, wind ensemble works, and extended multi-movement works for chorus and orchestra. His Requiem for the Living (2013) and Jubilate Deo (2016) have become standard choral/orchestral repertoire for ensembles globally.

Forrest earned a Doctorate in Composition from the University of Kansas and also holds a Master's degree in piano performance. He served for several years as a University Professor and Department Head teaching music theory and composition. He is now an Editor at Beckenhorst Press, Chair of the American Choral Director's Association Composition Initiatives Committee, adjunct Faculty at Furman University, and Artist-In-Residence at Mitchell Road Presbyterian Church (Greenville, SC).
